# Here we Grow!: Sustaining the 8<sup>th</sup> and I Neighbors Park Garden Awarded: \$1.800

8<sup>th</sup> and I Neighbors will improve productivity by upgrading the soil with the addition of new topsoil and compost. Over the years, the brick paths have become overgrown with grass and weeds. The group will avoid using pesticides by using a propane weed burner to clean up and maintain the paths. Many shared gardening tools have disappeared and their replacement will help participants tend their gardens more easily. Repair of fences will help discourage vandalism, and an outdoor message kiosk will keep gardeners (and neighbors) aware of activities. In addition, at least four plots, sponsored by the gardeners, will be dedicated to growing organic crops for the My Sister's Pantry Food Bank.
