Electric vehicle owners get a charge new Evanston station

The new electric car charging station was pretty popular in its first month on Map the release:

Evanston residents and visitors were heavy users of the City's newest electric ca CRIME during its first month of service. 2nd Ward Alderman Peter Braithwaite encouraged City staff to install the first of the generation stations in the Maple Avenue Garage. Braithwaite said, "Due to the pr Maple Parking Garage, guests from the adjacent Hilton Garden Inn and visitors to shops and entertainment venues can charge their vehicles while they spend time downtown Fvanston."

The dual connection station was installed for less than \$12,000, which was funder Fund. Half of that expense will be repaid to the City as a rebate from the Departr and Economic Opportunity. The Maple Avenue Garage station complements other charging stations available There are two stations at Parking Lot 4 (Central St. at Stewart Ave.) and there is a solar canopy in Parking Lot 3 (northeast of the Main Evanston Public Library). The were installed through a partnership with I-Go; no public funds were expended.
