- Food waste in Korea causes global warming and energy waste, generating 8.85 million tons of greenhouse gases per year.
- Apartment residents tend not to reduce food waste without direct pressure.
- In accordance with the government's policy of using the pay-as-you-throw food waste management system, this project will help reduce food waste through public opinion surveys and promotional campaigns for the pay-as-you-throw food waste management system.
