TREE NEIGHBORHOOD PROGRAM

TreeBaltimore, a program of Baltimore City Recreation and Parks, recently launched the TreeNeighborhood program to provide FREE trees to residents of designated [Healthy Neighborhoods](#), and 1/2 price trees (\$10) to residents of all other neighborhoods. To find out if your neighborhood has been designated as a Healthy Neighborhood, see the list below.

We are asking a representative from each neighborhood to take the lead in finding out how many residents would like FREE trees for their lawns and yards. It is easy for your neighborhood to participate:

Publicize—Promote TreeNeighborhood to residents in your community. Individuals and large property owners such as schools, businesses and hospitals are eligible. Include the provided language in your upcoming neighborhood newsletter, talk about the program at neighborhood meetings, ask block captains or members of your board to go door-to-door to promote the program and take orders;

Request—Collect requests from your neighbors and submit them together on the TreeNeighborhood Order Form. Orders should be submitted to TreeBaltimore by October 20 for fall plantings or April 20 for spring plantings. Include one payment from your neighborhood. Remember, your neighborhood must order a minimum of 10 trees to qualify for FREE delivery;

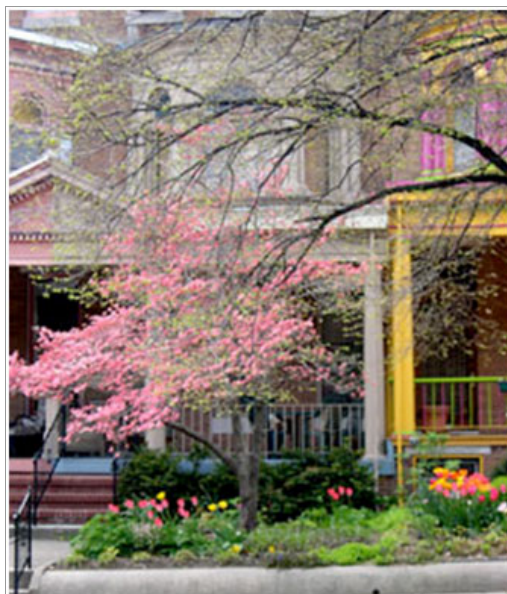
Plant—Have a planting party when your trees arrive! TreeBaltimore will deliver trees to a central location in each neighborhood.

TREE ACRES PROGRAM

TreeBaltimore works closely with large landowners to evaluate locations for trees for their property. We help select species and sizes of trees. Currently, trees can be purchased at an amazing discount through TreeBaltimore. And, trees will be delivered on site for a small fee. Landowners are responsible for planting and maintenance.

STREET TREE PROGRAM

Street trees are a very important part of an urban environment’s tree canopy. In seeing that a large portion of cities are covered by impervious surfaces (streets, building, parking lots, sidewalks, etc.), it is important to have a strong, healthy street tree population as part of our on-growing tree canopy. If you are interested in a tree in front of, or along, the side of your house, please download the [Street Tree Request Form](#). A street tree is a tree in the public right of way, such as the trees in the pits on the sidewalk.

If you are interested in doing something with street trees on a little wider scale for your neighborhood, you can orchestrate a neighborhood wide street tree pit inventory. The [Street Tree Inventory Form](#) can be used to get a better understanding of the street tree pits in your neighborhood. Once we know pit sizes, if stumps or dead trees are still in the pits, if you have just an empty pit, if there is room for a pit, etc., we can figure out a course of action to get your whole neighborhood planted. Once the planting is completed, please fill out the [new tree plantings data collection form](#) to help track new tree locations. It is important to get neighborhood support and [Street Tree Request Forms](#) for all the houses that are going to eventually get trees.
