The day has become one of the United Nations' primary ways to raise global awareness of environmental issues, and to stimulate political attention, public action, and personal commitment to preserving the environment. In its theme for 2014, World Environment Day focused on Small Islands Development States (SIDS). The theme was "Raise your voice, not the sea level"; intended to shine the spotlight on Small Islands and their unique development challenges and successes
